Giving Children a Head Start

SPARK — Strong, Prepared And Ready for Kindergarten — was founded in 2012 by a coalition of leading civic organizations including Fox Valley United Way, the Dunham Fund, the City of Aurora, School District 129, 131, 204 and 308. Together with these partners, SPARK is working to ensure that every child in Aurora is on a trajectory towards success in school and in life.

The collaboration made it possible for Aurora to be chosen by the State of Illinois as one of seven communities to receive federal dollars from the Race to the Top—Early Learning Challenge Grant. Over the next four years, the nearly \$550,000 in funding will be used to improve the quality of early childhood learning opportunities and increase resources and access for at-risk children.

To date, SPARK has reached out to more than 600 families through resource fairs, parent/child trainings and a new website: sparkaurora.org. The initiative has nearly doubled the number of eligible families in Aurora who are now approved to receive child care assistance — from 599 to 1107 — as well as the number of children participating in the program — from 1,198 to 2,214.

Helping the Community Save on Prescriptions



Too many people in our community struggle to afford their medications, and as a result, don't take them as prescribed. Yet not taking these medications in the short run can cause more problems in the long run. In fact, a 2011 Health Affairs study found that every dollar spent on drugs that stop the advancement of heart disease and diabetes saves \$3 to \$10 on other medical services down the road.

Fox Valley United Way has partnered with FamilyWize, a prescription drug discount card that can save users up to 75% in medication costs at their local pharmacy. The card is free and can be used by anyone, regardless of insurance coverage.

To date, **1,489 Fox Valley cardholders** have saved \$124,890 with FamilyWize. We love participating in this program, because it impacts health and financial stability, two of the three areas that affect the common good.







After the first of the year, when area food pantries are low after bustling holiday demand, the Fox Valley United Way sponsors the Souper Bowl of Caring. Held each year on the Saturday before the Super Bowl, this event gathers youth volunteers to solicit food and monetary donations within our local Jewel-Osco stores, Montgomery Market Place and Prisco's Fine Foods.

Donations are then delivered to the Aurora Interfaith Food Pantry and the Kendall County Food Pantry to help restock their shelves. This year, our volunteers received 3,365 pounds of food and \$ 7,250 in cash donations.

The best part is that in addition to the food donations, every dollar raised enables the pantries to purchase \$6 worth of food — making the community impact this year worth more than \$43,500.




