

Numerous studies show that the first five years of a person's life set the trajectory for the rest of their days. When children are healthy and developmentally prepared for kindergarten, they are more likely to graduate high school, go to college, own a home, earn a higher wage and less likely to commit a crime.

Investing in our children creates huge returns for families and entire communities. Unfortunately, too many children in our 23 communities will fall behind due to poverty, language barriers and lack of access to high quality early learning opportunities.

Our SPARK initiative is recognized statewide as a holistic and collaborative model for tackling conditions that affect a child's success in school and beyond.

We are: • Supporting social service agencies that address basic needs (food, shelter, healthcare);

- Leading collaboration with educators to improve the access to and quality of early childhood learning opportunities;
- Working with parents to provide education on healthy child-rearing and to connect with local resources;
- Screening children for developmental concerns and referring for programs and services (intake).

VNA Health Care in Aurora provides affordable care to many area residents who are medically underserved. The demand for their Women Infants and Children (WIC) services means that wait times can average 80 minutes. Believing this a great opportunity to engage with families and young children, SPARK teamed up with VNA to create a Play. Learn. Connect. Family Resource Center within the WIC waiting room.

Manned by SPARK staff and volunteers, the Center assists families who have questions about child development, parenting and area early childhood programs and services.

The Center is one more way that our SPARK program is reaching into the community to tangibly improve the lives of children in need.

Funding for the Family Resource Center was provided by the Robert R. McCormick Foundation, Dunham Fund, Gustafson Family Foundation of the DuPage Foundation and Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley.





When community members cannot afford prescription medication, their health suffers. And when an individual suffers, families and communities are affected as well.

Because of ongoing rising costs of prescriptions, we are proud to partner with **FamilyWize** prescription drug discount cards. By distributing their cards at events and online, we've helped our neighbors save up to 75% at most pharmacies on medications not covered, or not fully covered, by health insurance. 
